From a boy soprano singing in the Medbury School choir, Teddy Tahu Rhodes became an internationally renowned operatic bass-baritone performing on opera stages and concert platforms throughout the world.

Teddy's vocal talent nurtured at College, has taken him to opera companies in the USA, Europe and the United Kingdom; these days he is based in Melbourne, Australia.

At College, he sang in Chapel Choir, was in the choral group the Madrigal Singers, and was Head of Corfe. He sang in the New Zealand Youth Choir and studied Music and Commerce at the University of Canterbury before winning a scholarship to study at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama in London. Opera Australia subsequently offered him a role — and his professional career was launched. He has won numerous awards for his performances of the opera repertoire — from romantic heroes to evil villains — has an extensive discography, and is widely acclaimed as an exceptional singer and actor.
