## Sir Frederick Miles Warren, ONZ, KBE, FNZIA

Sir Miles Warren is one of New Zealand's foremost architects, as well as a skilled watercolour artist and landscape designer.

He started his architectural training in Cecil Wood's office, before completing his studies at the University of Auckland. After several years working in London, he returned to Christchurch and, in 1958, became a founding partner of architectural practice Warren and Mahoney.

He was instrumental in developing the Christchurch style of modernist architecture, and designed some of the city's most iconic buildings. Miles was inspired by and has had a long involvement in the curation and design of College buildings – and his foresight in initiating earthquake strengthening can never be understated.

Miles is also a keen and talented gardener and, in partnership with his sister and brother-in-law Pauline and John Trengrove, created the stunning formal garden at Ohinetahi, his home in Governors Bay.
