## Curriculum News



If you are or have ever been a runner, you'll know the feeling well. It's that feeling when, after pounding out 10km or 21km or even 42km, you see the finish line of a race up ahead. I may be that most pathetic of creatures, a permanently damaged runner, but I can still recall the feeling only too well. I also recall, with the finish line apparently just

up ahead, the grit and determination that it takes to push on for that last kilometre which seems to go on endlessly. Your legs are saying "No more, no more" and your brain is saying "Keep going, you know you can do it, we haven't come this far to stop now" (actually my own inner voice always seemed to be far more abusive than that).

This isn't an ex-runner's column. These are the same feelings many of our boys are having right now, as they push on into the final NCEA examination season. It has been a long haul, the weather is warming up, the blue skies outside keep beckoning and then there are those mates who have actually finished the last of their own examinations and come along with an invitation to play touch or to go to the beach. This is the time when real grit is required. I have periodically talked about Art Costa's Habits of Mind. Yes, I'm a fan. These are, after all, characteristics that Costa and his team observed repeatedly in successful people across many pursuits, across many walks of life, across cultures and national borders. And perseverance is one of them. I bang the drum about this one more often than most (apart perhaps from the need for accuracy) because it is in my opinion, such an essential foundational personal attribute for all of the others.

So when the examination season is drawing to a close and your son has a couple of those examinations left even though his mates have finished, remind him of the need to finish the race, to do the job properly. It's an exercise in deferred gratification, and there seem to be numerous studies around to show that the ability of younger people to defer rewards is also a critical determinant of their future success.

Encourage him to see it out. If it's that last Scholarship examination for which he is waiting, encourage him to last the distance. That last kilometre is pretty tough. But we don't give up. EVER!!

### Careers



#### Sussed - Study Link

By now, students should have applied for loans or allowances, <u>www.studylink.govt.nz</u>. The sooner they complete the SussedOnline tool, the better off they will be. Boys should apply for their loans and allowances by 16 December. In October, Study Link received a total of 33,064 applications - that's 8795

more than October 2014. Applying for the first time requires a range of information which includes providing identity. First time applicants can do this by using RealMe. Students can sign up online for their RealMe verified identity and then get a free photo taken to complete the process at participating PostShops. This means that students can prove who they are without having to provide copies of a passport or birth certificate.

#### **Dux Scholarships**

**University of Otago** - This scholarship is available to the 2015 Dux of schools. There are no other criteria to be met. It is valued at \$6000 for those students who have not been offered one of the university's other main scholarships. This year, if the Dux has received another scholarship, they will also receive a partial value of the Dux Scholarship in conjunction with the other scholarship. For example, if the Dux secures a Leaders of Tomorrow Scholarship (value \$6000), they will receive the Dux's Scholarship with a half stipend of \$3000, giving a total package of \$9000.

**University of Canterbury** - The scholarship is valued at \$5000. It may not be held with any scholarship or award that comprises payment of tuition fees, with the exception that recipients may hold both a UC Dux Scholarship and an Emerging Leader Scholarship. In such a case, the Dux Scholarship would be held in name only.

#### University of Canterbury - College of Engineering

E-Week, Sunday 17 to Friday 22 April 2016, is a week-long camp for high school students hosted by the Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering at the university. Students must be enrolled in Year 12 or 13 in 2016, and be taking physics and calculus. The course is free for successful applicants. They will be accommodated in one of the halls of residence on campus and all food is supplied. The invitation was sent to the Head of Physics in each school.
