## **NCEA** results

Bucking the national trend, our Year 12 students have lifted their Level 2 pass rates – an impressive overall effort that reflects favourably on everyone. While the full national results will not be available until April, our provisional figures point to a positive achievement outcome for College in 2023. Likewise, our Year 13s also have had great success in meeting their goals as well, whether it be apprenticeships or university, with continued high pass rates for their chosen qualification pathways. Despite the challenges for learning – both in New Zealand and globally – over the past few years, our results are admirable for all involved. The College website will be updated following the release of the full national NCEA figures by NZQA.

## **Child Protection Policy**

Fundamental to schools is child protection and safety and, with this in mind, this year, as a normal part of our professional learning cycle, all College staff will undergo further training with the highly respected New Zealand-based organisation, Child Matters. This training is part of being employed at the school and provides confidence for parents that our staff are informed and proactive in recognising and reporting any signs of child mistreatment, both within and beyond the school. This training also reminds all staff of their own professional obligations in relation to their appropriate conduct and boundaries, both while in school and beyond, when engaging with children and reinforces policies College has had in place for a number of years. Throughout the year, students will again have sessions that match those of the staff so that our culture of safety and reporting is maintained as part of the College experience. ## Upper West update

Work on the multi-purpose sports centre has rapidly progressed in late 2023. This includes:

- the completion of the external envelope, meaning that the building is secure and closed in
- final services and decoration for the northern end of the building being largely complete
- the delivery of the sports floor and tiered seating, ready for installation
- the start of the external work, with paths and fence posts around the building.

The project is planned to be completed in Term 1, with handover in time for full use from Term 2. The Upper field refurbishment project is also now under way and availability will depend on the grass growth.

## In memory of Bishop Richard Wallace



We acknowledge the passing of The Bishop of the Anglican Māori Diocese of Te Waipounamu, the Right Reverend Richard Rangi Wallace. Bishop Richard was a strong and supportive leader who regularly contributed to College life and often played a pivotal role in College celebrations and special events. He was a greatly valued member of our wider College community. Bishop Richard died in Wairoa on 6 January. He was 78.

Bishop Richard was the first Kai Tahu Pīhopa and the second Bishop of Te Waipounamu. As well as Kai Tahu, he had links

to Ngāi Tuahuriri, Kāti Wheke, Taumutu, Koukourata, Kāti Mahaki, Kāti Waewae, Kāti Irakehu, Kāti Tama, Kāti Raroa, and Kāti Maniapoto. In his leadership as Pīhopa o Te Waipounamu, Bishop Richard leaves a legacy of strengthened relationships between iwi and hāhi in many communities.

## Make a good impression

We expect all boys to take care of their appearance and maintain high standards of personal care. Our uniform and grooming standards encourage selfrespect and self-management and instil a sense of pride in being part of the College community. We appreciate your support in reinforcing these expectations.

It was obvious as boys walked across the stage at Prize-giving at the end of last year that current haircut 'trends' had begun to test our resolve as parents and school in this area. We want to begin the year well and highlight that unless boys have a couple of haircuts per term, a school-enforced absence may result. Housemasters are the first port of call regarding the standards outlined below, and we ask that parents and students act on their advice.

## Uniform

All boys should have

- clean uniform
- belts (black) for their shorts and trousers
- black shoes (either lace-up or slip-on)

   not boots
- shirts that fit around the neck
- short black and white socks.

## Hair

Boys must be clean-shaven at all times and should make sure their hair

- is kept neat, clean, and tidy
- is kept clear of the collar, off the ears, and off the eyebrows
- is not dyed or gelled, tied up or pinned
- is not shorter than a 'number 2'
- does not have lines or designs shaved into it, or sideburns that extend below the opening to the ear
- does not have long sections that can be fashioned into long fringes, dreadlocks, plaits, rats' tails, mohawks, top knots or mullets.

There may be some exceptions to the above for cultural or other reasons. Deputy Principal – Student Care Ben Vink will be final arbiter of any decisions relating to hair and personal appearance.

## Domestic Staff – School House


