# Dear parents and caregivers



In our last week of Term 3, we revived an important tradition as part of our 175th celebrations – Spring Carnival. It is a special week, with boys engaging in a wide range of activities in which everything is organised by the boys, for the boys. This is student leadership in action, where our young men are entrusted with ownership, initiative, and creativity. During this week, we also had the pleasure of announcing the 2026 Prefects, another reminder of

the central role student leadership plays in the life of Christ's College.

At College, we place great emphasis on the development of leadership because we believe it is one of the most powerful ways young men can grow in character. Old Boy – and 2020 Tokyo Olympics gold medallist – Sam Bosworth will join the College rowing coaches this season. A Senior Honours Tie recipient, Sam won gold as the coxswain for the men's eight at the

2020 Olympics. Sam coxed his College crew to win the Maadi Cup in 2012 before being selected for the national junior men's coxed four and guiding the New Zealand crew to gold at the World Rowing Junior Championships. He then stepped up to the U23 level, winning gold in 2016. In 2017, he coxed the elite women's eight, winning World Rowing Cup gold and silver, and then bronze at the World Rowing Championships.



# Andrew Ellis 1st XI cricket coach

Andrew Ellis has been appointed Head Coach of the College 1st XI. A former Black Cap and longserving Canterbury representative, Andrew has had a distinguished domestic and international career

that includes more than 350 matches for the province and 20 matches for the national side. At present, he is the South Island Manager at High Performance Sport New Zealand. He will work alongside Assistant Coach Louis Gunn.

## Year 11

#### **Exams**

All College Diploma prep courses, where appropriate, will have an examination. Exams will run from Wednesday 19 November–Wednesday 26 November. During these exams, boys will be on study leave to focus on performing at their best. Exam results will be used to determine their readiness for chosen NCEA subjects.

#### End-of-year experience - Finding Your Pathway

Year 11 students will then have their end-of-year experience as they complete the Ngā Miha Mātauranga – Christ's College Diploma. The focus will be on the transition from the College Diploma to readiness for NCEA. Year 11 students will spend the last days of the school year taking part in our 'Finding Your Pathway' programme. Graduating from the Diploma into NCEA study is a good time to start thinking about the post-College options available. The programme will include visits to tertiary institutions and local businesses, along with on-site career workshops led by Old Boys. This programme has been designed to broaden boys' thinking about potential education and career pathways at an important transition time. It will run from Monday 1 December–Thursday 4 December.

# Year 10

#### End of year

Classes for Year 10 students will finish on Tuesday 25 November. During the following seven days, the boys will be involved in multiple experiences, including the Kōhititia programme or a marae visit, and then a community service programme. All will contribute to your son's Ngā Miha Mātauranga – Christ's College Diploma. This will conclude on Thursday 4 December.

# Year 9

#### Final week

Classes for Year 9 students will finish on Wednesday 26 November. Following this, the boys will be involved in an outdoor education programme, including a two-day overnight camp and four day trips. Boys will attend a compulsory pre-camp briefing, with the date confirmed later in Term 4. Camp commitments will, where possible, accommodate any junior sport tournaments or co-curricular activities that take place during this time. This will conclude on Thursday 4 December.


