It will be superseded in due course by more detailed project information, but as we are approaching completion of our new complex, there are further ambitious plans on the table.

I am delighted to announce that, having laboured under the title 'The West Wing' to date, the Board has approved the naming of the main building The Sir Miles Warren building, to be usually known as 'The Warren Building'. We are recognising Sir Miles' long association with College, and his leadership in ensuring our campus was well prepared for the events of 2010 and 2011. Our architect, Alec Bruce, expressed his pleasure at the choice. Two rooms within the complex are also named – the public space on the ground floor will be known as 'The Chapman Room', and the staff room/sports lounge will be 'The Coles Room', after The Rev David Coles, formerly Bishop of Christchurch and Warden, whose interest in, and affection for, the College was appreciated by all.

Meanwhile our remodelling of the reception area for College is going ahead, but already we have a lot of very good feedback about the temporary arrangement. The bursar's staff are now settled in Armagh Street, and I thank them for their help with restructuring the various roles between the two locations. We will shortly be welcoming Shelley Keach to College working with Ric Fletcher in Development; she will be accommodated in the downstairs office, and when our new reception is complete, the existing office will become the centre of our Development activity. Lastly on facilities, the temporary Armagh Street classroom has been removed, and others will follow as they can be released from now on. At one time we had 26 temporary classrooms – now down to 15, and the end for them is nigh!

### From the Chaplain



From recent Chapel collections we were able to send \$2,000 to help in Gaza. Getting help there is obviously difficult, but people are managing to deliver food, water, hygiene kits, hot meals, and shelter materials. Specialist medical teams have gone in, people are working with three maternal health clinics, and so on. Some work is obviously on hold. An

interesting exercise is to use <a href="http://www.ahmadnassri.com/labs/gaza-everywhere">http://www.ahmadnassri.com/labs/gaza-everywhere</a> to compare Gaza's size with other areas (it stretches from Rangiora to Rolleston). Just under 2 million people live in this area. We are now raising money for the Christchurch City Mission, and the City Missioner will be with us next Sunday.

In Year 11, students are beginning the study of ethics, morals, and values. There have been some good discussions developed from the recent screening of the documentary on Gloriavale, and how to keep ourselves safe from cults and unhealthy religion. Year 10 students are doing a variety of studies. In Year 9 we are continuing from where we started with Abraham and are now learning about and from the Moses stories.

In Chapel we are mostly looking at the time around the Babylonian Exile more than two and a half millennia ago. There is so much we can learn from that watershed period in human history.

### Curriculum News



I suspect that we all share concerns about the impact of the increasingly digital world in which we live. Some would argue that it's because we are 'digital migrants' whereas our children are 'digital natives', but there is no evidence to support that view of our ability to use technology at all. Amongst our concerns we would probably number distraction, 'gaming addictions and personal

safety, and it would not be difficult to find horror stories in any of these contexts.

We are aware that many parents have concerns about these and other issues. Accordingly we have invited well known adviser and presenter John Parsons to work with members of the College community on a range of aspects of cyber safety. He will be running workshops with all boys in Years 9 and 10, with staff, and with parents.

Ross Shillito has spent the last 12 months studying Chemistry from his initial Year 12 content all the way through to top University level syllabus. Through a comprehensive training programme he grew his chemistry knowledge to a level suitable to compete alongside other NZ students at a training camp in April. Success at the training camp earned him a place as one of four New Zealand representatives at the 46th International Chemistry Olympiad in Vietnam. In attendance were 300 top Chemistry students from 75 different countries worldwide. Ross was placed 115th and was awarded a top Bronze Medal as a result, earning him a place in New Zealand history alongside other top achieving Chemists.
