Acknowledgement of Prizes

AE Flower Prize for Science

Recognises Arthur Edward Flower (1301), staff 1897–1937, Acting Headmaster (1912, 1914, 1920) and Fellow (1939-1952)

AK & DF Hancock Prize for the Head Treble

Legacy of Ruby Elsie Hancock in memory of her sons, Albert Keith Hancock (3652) and Desmond Field Hancock (4164). Both killed in action World War II

Andrew K Allison Prize for Instrumental Music

Given by the Allison Family in memory of Andrew K Allison (5006)

Balfour Prize for Religious Education

Gift of the Hon. Arthur James Balfour, MP and later (1902–1905) Prime Minister of the United Kingdom

Balfour Prize for the Deputy Head of Chapel Choir

Barnett Prizes for Biology, Chemistry, General Science, Mathematics and Physics Gift of Sir Louis Barnett in memory of Ralph Fulton Barnett (2306). Killed in action World War I

Benjamin MN Fulton Cup for contribution to the Big Band

Presented by the Fulton family (1745)

Cathedral Grammar Cup for Singing

Presented by The Cathedral Grammar School

DJO Davis Prize for Chemistry

In memory of Douglas John O'Donel Davis (4237)

Denham Memorial Prize for English Composition

Given by the family of Conrad Nelder Denham (1630)

Dr FG Westenra Prize for Medical Studies

From a legacy of RG Westenra to acknowledge his father Dr Fitzgerald George Westenra (404)

Gordon Harris Prize for Design and Visual Communication

Gift of the Harris family of Gordon Harris, in support of design education at Christ's College. Gordon Harris is New Zealand's leading art and graphic store

HE Solomon Prize for Geography Harry Earle Solomon, staff 1920–1960

Jeremy Stammers-Smith Prize for Head of Chapel Choir

Given by Mrs E Stammers-Smith in memory of Jeremy Stammers-Smith (6083)

John H Atkinson Prize for History

Given by Mrs MLY Atkinson in memory of her husband John Henry Atkinson (3254)

The Neave Prizes for Classical Studies, French, Spoken French and Modern Languages

Given by Adelaide Neave in memory of Kenelm Neave (1373)

KM Sturrock Award for the Most Improved Intermediate Pianist

Kath Sturrock was an itinerant teacher of Music

Le Cren Prizes for Geography and Science

A legacy from Leslie Jaumaud Le Cren (2938)

Major Rattray Prizes for English Literature and Debating

A legacy from Major Neil Aylmer Rattray (2462)

Nichols Prize for Science

Gift of Colonel J Cowie Nichols in memory of his brother Walter Harry Nichols (1399), who died as a prisoner of war, and his two sons, Cyril Robert Nichols (24526) and Joseph Cowie Nichols (2525), both killed in action World War I

Penlington Cup for Consistent Effort in Art

Given in memory of Rodney John Spenser Penlington (6801)

Schola Cantorum Cooke Trophy

Presented by Louis Benjamin Cooke (13688)

Sedley Wells Prize for Music

From the estate of Sedley George Wells, whose sons David Malcolm Wells (6472), Richard Sedley Wells (5630) and Murray Charles Wells (5904) were at College

Tancred Prizes for History and English

Given by Mrs Georgiana Tancred in memory of her husband the Hon. Henry John Tancred, Fellow of Christ's College (1856–1884) and Hulsean-Chichele Professor of Modern History in the Upper Department

TR Moore Prize for English, English as a Second Language and Mathematics

A legacy from Thomas Richard Moore (93)

Tom Cooper Memorial Prizes for Debating and Public Speaking

Given by Colonel and Mrs C Cooper in memory of Charles Thomas Cooper (2784)

Tyndale Prize for Religious Education

Gift of RJS Harman (Fellow 1868–1897). The prize recognises (through a collateral descent) William Tyndale, reformer and translator of the Bible

Head Prefect's Prize

Gift of George Albert Umbdenstock Tapper (952)

HM Chrystall Prize for All-round Merit in Sport and Scholarship

From a legacy of Harvey Maitland Chrystall (1808)

Maling Memorial Prize for Outstanding Service to the School

Gift of Mrs Maling in memory of her husband Thomas James Maling (748)

Ormsby Memorial Medal

Established by the Old Boys of South Canterbury in memory of Charles Montague Ormsby (1376)

Wacher Prize for Academic Head of School

From a legacy of Charles Edgar Weston Wacher (3214). Wacher was Academic Head of School in 1924

Somes Prize for Outstanding Overall Contribution to the Arts and General Scholarship

Named for Maria Somes, benefactress who created the Somes Scholarships and Exhibitions in memory of her husband Sir Joseph Somes

Tony Holland Memorial Cup for Commitment and Endeavour

Awarded to a hard-working student who has persevered to achieve their potential or overcome difficulties, and who also shows empathy and caring towards others

Charles Upham Award for Character

These awards celebrate character strengths in action in the classroom, around the school and in the community. Up to two awards are made in each year group.

They are named after College Old Boy, Charles Upham, who was awarded the Victoria Cross and bar during World War II. Charles Upham is recognised for his strengths of humility, courage, perseverance and leadership.

To be eligible for this award, a student must have received a Character Award during the year.
