Dear parents and caregivers

In the first week of the term break, I, along with several staff, attended the 2023 International Boys' Schools Coalition (IBSC) annual conference, hosted this year by Westlake Boys High School in Auckland.

The conference brought together more than 640 boys' educators from around the world, exploring the theme of 'Dream beyond limits'.

There were several highlights, including keynote speakers of the calibre of Sir Ian Taylor, Director of Animation Research Ltd, Westlake BHS alumni William Pike, who is the founder of the William Pike Challenge Award for primary school students – for many, a precursor to the Duke of Edinburgh Awards – and Dr Tony Fernando, a psychiatrist and sleep specialist, Buddhist monk, and recipient of the Chair's Award from the New Zealand Medical Association. The latter is the highest association recognition given to any doctor for his work on physician wellbeing.

A wide range of workshops facilitated professional learning and conversation. I was very proud that three staff members made contributions. Caroline Black, our Director of Wellbeing Education, spoke on A Wellbeing Lens Specific to Boys' Education, Chris Waugh presented his Action Research, that has taken place over the last 12 months, titled Pull a Seat up to the Table: The Enfranchising Effect of Placing Queer Students in

Such tours only happen because of the willingness of staff to give of their time and energy, and, along with the boys and families who benefit, I am thankful for such dedication.
