#### The Courage to 'nark'

One of the defining characteristics of a College Graduate is 'Courage & resilience' – having the mental and moral strength to venture, persevere, withstand danger and confront fear or difficulty. It is these behaviours I expect of all boys when it comes to calling out behaviour that does not reflect respect, compassion or justice in this and the wider community. We must all be UPSTANDERS (not BYSTANDERS) and champion that which is right. When one sees another behaving in a way that might cause short or long-term harm, we must act alone or seek help to stop that behaviour. Standing up may have a personal cost but that is the true test of a moral compass. We are seeing this courage in young women across our own and the world community at present as they step forward to call out sexual abuse. We see this courage in some members of our Old Boy community as they come forward to tell stories of abuse experienced while here at Christ's College. I acknowledge this courage and seek, with your help, to ensure that our College today allows for such courage to be current and present.

It would seem that far too many boys within College for far too many years have stood silently by too often, despite the internal conflict this would have caused, and allowed inappropriate and harmful behaviour to be perpetrated on others, by word or by deed, for the fear of being known as the 'nark'. We need to address this overtly and clearly by being courageous. Such courage can be both personal and immediate by calling out the behaviour as it takes place and intervening or by calling on the support of friends or family of like mind and/or the College support structures ... your Head of House or another senior student who you trust, your mentor or Housemaster, an appointed prefect or teacher and our College counsellors. 


Retiring Cricket and Sports Groundsperson
